Section I Cut Flowers

- Section 2 Cut Ornamental Foliage
- Section 3 Cut flowering shrub or tree
- Section 4 Cut foliage shrub or tree
- Section 5. Edible Offerings
- Section 6. Container Grown Plants-Foliage (except Bromeliads)
- Section 7. Container Grown Plants-Flowering (Except Bromeliads)

Division II Design

"A Legacy of Leaves" Plant material may be fresh and/or dried.

Class 1. **"Little, Lovely & Leafy"** A petite design staged on GCGC blue stand, against light colored wall. Max. dimension 6".

Class 2. **"Take a Leaf from a Book"** A petite design staged on a book, against light colored wall. Max. dimension 12".

Class 3. **"Bright, Fresh Start"** A design of any style, staged in a colored trifold, 36" high, open to 24" and 29" deep.

Class 4. **"Leave Me Out of This, said the Flower!"** A design using only foliage, no flowers, buds or berries. Staged freestanding on black pedestals 40" high, with square tops 24" x 24".

Blue Star Memorials

The Blue Star Memorial Marker Program of National Garden Clubs, Inc. was conceived by Garden Club of New Jersey in 1945 to honor the men and women serving in the Armed Forces during World War II. The name came from the blue stars depicted in the Congressionally approved Service Flag displayed in the front window of homes where a family member was serving in the Armed Forces. A ribbon of living memorial plantings traversing highways across the country was envisioned. New Jersey was the first state to designate and plant a Blue Star Memorial on Route 22, the road heading West from New York City. Thousands of dogwood trees, NJ's State Tree, were planted in the median along many miles.

I grew up very near there, and remember my parents telling me as we drove past, what the big sign meant, and how important it was to remember and honor those who fought for our country.

Many years and many wars later, the Blue Star program



is thriving! There are over 3,000 around the country. Only NGC clubs may sponsor these markers, in cooperation with local communities. GCGC hopes to sponsor a Highway marker on 41, in cooperation with the City of Bonita Springs.
