Blue Star Memorial History

In 1946, National Garden Clubs, Inc. adopted a nationwide *Blue Star Memorial Highway Program* to be implemented as a living tribute to the men and women who served in the Armed Forces of the United States of America. The Garden Club of New Jersey had begun this by planting 10,000 dogwood trees along Route 22 after WWII. The program was subsequently endorsed by all 50 states, including the Florida Federation of Garden Clubs. (FFGC). Later it was expanded to honor all those who have served, are serving, or will serve in the future.

The name commemorates the blue star placed in the windows or in front of homes during WWII to denote a member of the family was serving in the nation's Armed Forces. A silver star meant wounded, and a gold star signified deceased.

The Blue Star Memorial program has been expanded to include smaller By Way Markers for placement in public parks, civic and historical grounds. Another Blue Star Marker has been created for placement at Veterans Administration facilities, National Cemeteries, and other suitable civic locations. FFGC has installed this marker at every one of Florida's nine National Cemeteries.

To date, over 3,000 Blue Star Memorial Markers have been dedicated across the country, in all 50 states.
